# • Playground Update (N. Wallace)

- Started back in 2021, County advised playground up for renewal
- Fundraising through various sources and grants took place
- Parents have been working with the County to get proposals for the work
- Students were surveyed for their playground wish lists and the county was informed of the data collected
- January to April will continue to work with the county for a company to supply/build the equipment
- Expect to break ground this summer

# ASCE Grant (Alberta School Council Engagement)

- Council has \$500 to use for parent engagement. The grant comes with very specific requirements on the type of engagement it can be used for

### c) NEW BUSINESS

- Grade 8 Trip (A. Medvescek, H. Jones, J. Correia, G. Correia)
  - Grade 8 English track parents feel they were not given enough information regarding the trip before it was cancelled
    - Statements were read by some parents explaining why they felt the situation was not handled fairly for all students/families
    - Lengthy discussions regarding past, present and future trips were heard from several parents
    - $\circ$   $\,$  Discussion was held on ways to improve communication in the future
    - The purpose, values, commonality, and distinct differences of having the two separate trips were discussed which outlined why the trips will not combine English and French students together
    - Fundraising for the 2022/23 trip was discussed and going forward the fundraising committee will ensure that all correspondence clearly state the support is for the French Immersion trip
    - With this being the first year of planning a dual track trip, challenges were brought forward, discussed, and will be considered to help improve the planning and communication in the coming years.
  - A formal complaint was put forward to Brett Cox, Assistant-Superintendent at EICS. Due to the official investigation from EICS, the school was not able to answer a lot of questions. Once M. Morin has

received further results from EICS investigation, they will be used in future decisions.

- $\circ$  The ultimate goal is to work together in the best interest of the children at OLPH
- It was agreed that there is value in the grade 8 trip and that it should continue in the future
